6. Science
7. Business and Economic Sciences

Oppidani Ballot

1. For Oppidani students only
2. 24 Candidates
3. 8 Vacancies
4. Up to 8 votes per voter

Disability Ballot

1. For disabled students only
2. 2 Candidates
3. 1 Vote per voter

International Ballot

1. For International Students only
2. 3 Candidates
3. 1 Vote per voter

Online Voting

Requirements

You will need the following to cast your ballot

1. A reliable electronic device that is connected to the internet. This could be a smart phone, a laptop, desktop or tablet
2. Voting credentials

Online Voting

Voting onsite at a
kiosk

1. Physical sites located on campus will be available for you to go to for voting if this is your preferred way of voting
2. The sites will be published on the election website
3. Kiosks will be open from 08h00 to 19h00 daily
4. Each physical site will have an electronic device that is connected to the internet
5. The same election system will be accessible on the device
6. An election official will be available at each site to assist you

Online Voting

Steps to casting your vote online



Online voting will be open from 8am to 7pm on 27 and 28 October 2021

The Online Voting Steps are:

1. Get your voting credentials via Email and SMS
2. Access the voting link
3. Provide your credentials
4. Make your choices
5. Review and edit choices
6. Submit
7. Get a Verification Receipt

STEP 1

Get Your Voting Credentials



What credentials are required?

1. Access Key (16-digit unique alpha-numeric PIN). It can be used only once.
2. Student Number

Where do I get the Credentials from?

1. **Email:** from the independent election administrator
2. **SMS:** from the independent election administrator
3. **Election Website:** "Access Key Request" button on the home page

Are the Access Keys on email, SMS and the election platform different?

1. Only one unique access key is assigned to each student
2. Accessing the key via email, SMS and/or website will provide you with the same key

STEP 2

Access the Voting Link



What is a Voting Link?

The voting link provides you with access to the voting platform. It is a shortcut to the voting system

How do I get the link?

1. Email
2. SMS
3. Election Platform

What if the link does not work?

1. Check your internet connection
2. Avoid copying and pasting the link. The most reliable way is to click on the link to access the voting system

STEP 3

Provide your credentials



The voting system will request you to provide your access key and student number when using a computer to vote

Access Key

1. Make sure that there are no spaces before, in-between and after the access key when copying and pasting it
2. If transcribing the access key, make sure that it is done accurately and that you do not miss a digit/character

STEP 4

Make your choices

1. You have to cast your votes across all the ballots provided to you
2. Each ballot will have candidates who will be listed alphabetically by surname
3. You will be able to scroll down from one ballot to the next
4. You may choose to abstain from casting your vote in any of the ballots. To do so you will select the "Abstain" option
5. Choices are made by clicking in the box next to the candidate's name on the right

STEP 5

Review and edit your choices

1. Once your choices are made, you will have the option to see the choices FOR ALL BALLOTS and to review and edit them
2. You will be able to make completely new choices on any or all the ballots
3. Once the review and editing is done you will then confirm the choices and submit your ballot
4. You only submit once for all ballots

STEP 6

Submitting your ballot

1. To submit your ballot you need to press the submit button by clicking on it.
2. Once the ballot is submitted, you will not be able to vote again

STEP 7

Verification Receipt

1. A verification receipt will be displayed on screen as proof of voting
2. The receipt contains a unique verification code that unique links you ballot to your profile on the system
3. The verification receipt is used for audit purposes

Results

Announcement and Publication

1. The results will be available 15 minutes after voting closes
2. Agents and Candidates will be invited to a results announcement session
3. The results will be placed on the website immediately following the announcement

Reports

Post-election Reports

1. Results Tally Report (By Ballot and Campus)
 - a. Total Eligible per ballot
 - b. Total Votes cast per ballot
 - c. Abstentions
 - d. Votes obtained per candidate
2. Voter Status Report
 - a. Voted/Not Voted status per eligible voter
3. Access Keys Issued by Email and SMS
4. Access Keys Requested and Issued via the website
5. Reports to auditors
